### 2014.02.04 **Policy issues**

.04a Proposed Amendments to Registration and Quality Assurance Regulation: Status Update

The Registrar informed the Council that the sealed and signed regulations have been returned to the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (MOHLTC). The Policy Analyst at the Ministry has advised that the necessary steps will be completed so that the regulation amendments can be placed on the agenda of the meeting of the Standing Committee on Legislation and Regulation when legislature resumes.

- .04b Council Decision March 2013: Further Discussion
  - (1) Report from the Task Force on Shaping the Future of Psychology Regulation in Ontario
  - (2) Discussions with the Office of the Fairness Commissioner

The Council received a copy of the report from the Task Force on Shaping the Future of Psychology Regulation in Ontario which the Council had previously discussed in March 2013. The Chair of the Task Force, Mr. Peter McKegney, provided a brief summary of the processes of the Task force and the recommendations that were brought to the Council meeting in March 2013. At that Council meeting, the Council had voted unanimously to adopt Option 2 of the Task Force Report:

to discontinue master's level registration, grandparent Psychological Associates as Psychologists and develop a mechanism for evaluating internationally trained applicants

- a. Cease to accept master's level applications as of a set date
- b. Register all Psychological Associates as Psychologists on a fixed date, or within a fixed time period.
- c. Develop a mechanism for evaluating internationally trained applicants' competencies for substantial similarity to a CPA accredited program and remediation as needed, regardless of whether they have obtained a master's degree or a doctoral degree.

The Council had directed that the Registrar develop an Implementation plan for the provisions of Option 2. There was no further action taken to implement the above decisions because shortly after the March 2013 Council meeting, the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (MOHLTC) directed that the College recirculate for stakeholder consultation and resubmit to the Ministry the Registration Regulation Amendments that had previously been circulated for a 60 day stakeholder consultation and submitted to the Ministry incorporating feedback from the consultation.

The revised regulation has now been sealed and signed by the President and the Registrar and returned to the Ministry. The Regulation is now awaiting the steps for the final approval process before it is proclaimed and will be in force.

In 2013, the title issue and the closing of the masters level registration were joined at the direction of the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (MOHLTC). At this meeting, the Council reviewed the March 2013 report for further discussion. The Council was asked to decide whether to:

- Move forward with implementation plans for the Council decision from March 2013;
- Amend the motion from March 2013; or
- Make a new motion to separate the two issues

The Registrar advised that procedurally, the Council would have to rescind the motion from March 2013 and make a new motion to separate the two issues.

At times during the discussion of this agenda item, the President requested the Vice-President to take the Chair and participated in the discussion.

### Discussion:

Closure of Masters level registration:

Concerns regarding availability of psychological services at remote areas of the province and College's duty to provide adequate access to services

Similar concerns regarding effect on services in school boards

There would be opposition from the Office of the Fairness Commissioner about closing the master's level registration and any resulting barriers for foreign trained applicants. The Office of the Fairness Commissioner would like the College to consider evaluating foreign trained applicants on the basis of competencies rather than degree.

Under Option 2, the College will be developing a mechanism to evaluate foreign trained applicants. The Council had discussed creating a limited class of registration. Some Council members noted that competency assessment may be the way to move forward and may change the focus of accredited programs. As a regulator, the role of the College is to define the entry level competencies for independent practice.

The Council noted that changes to the Agreement on Internal Trade (AIT) may have created confusion for the public and other professionals regarding the 3 groups of members that are now registered in Ontario:

Psychologists with doctoral degrees
Psychologists with masters degrees
Psychological Associates with masters degrees

Even if the College moved to the doctoral degree as the standard for Entry to Practice, under the AIT, the College would have to register as Psychologists, applicants from other provinces with Masters degrees and the title Psychologist.

Upcoming Issues that may influence Council decisions:

Several provinces are moving to doctoral degree as the Entry to Practice and providing adequate services is an issue that needs to be addressed separately. The Deputy Registrar commented that the Association of Canadian Psychology Regulatory Organizations (ACPRO) is discussing the development of National Standards for Entry to Practice which could have an impact on registration requirements of all provinces. As Chair of ACPRO, the Deputy Registrar was invited to attend a workshop on *Pan-Canadian Systems and Mutual Recognition Agreements* including representatives from Federal and provincial regulatory bodies and various levels of the Government. The mandate of the working group which works under the Forum of Labour Market Ministers of Canada is to develop a framework for assessment and recognition of foreign qualifications.

The Council noted that these issues have been discussed at various times in the past years and some Council members expressed the opinion that the Council should move forward and not revisit previous discussions.

In providing their recommendations to Council in March 2013, the Task Force had conducted an extensive survey to gather data on service needs, demographics of the profession, the availability of training opportunities, and training of international applicants and conducted stakeholder consultations.

There may be further changes coming to the AIT and the development of National Standards and the Council agreed that the any decision that is made by the Council now may need to be revisited and discussed in the future.

.04c Standards of Professional Conduct: Proposed review and timing of future reviews

At their meeting in April 2014, the Executive Committee considered that the previous review of the Standards of Professional Conduct

had been conducted in 2005 and agreed to recommend to Council that a policy be developed that the Standards of Professional Conduct be reviewed every 5 years and a Task Force be appointed to conduct the review.

The Council agreed that in the interests of public protection, the Standards should be reviewed more frequently than every 10 years so that they would be current with changes to legislation. The Council noted that the process of review of the Standards may take up to a year or more including review of the draft by Council, stakeholder consultation and Council approval of the revised Standards.

(2) Tri-Council Policy Statement: Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Humans: Brief Description and Relationship to the Jurisprudence and Ethics Examination

The Jurisprudence and Ethics Examination Committee recommended to Council that the Council adopt the Tri Council Policy Statement for Research involving humans in place of the American Psychological Association (APA) Ethics Standards. The Committee has made the same recommendation to the Chair of the Quality Assurance Committee and that section 16.3 of the By Law 16: Codes of Ethics and Practice for Members be amended to read as follows:

Of relevance to the practice of psychology, the College endorses the 2nd edition of *Tri-Council Policy Statement: Ethical Conduct for Research Involving Humans* published by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada, and Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, and the *Standards for Educational and Psychological Testing* published by the American Educational Research Association.

That By-Law 16: Codes of Ethics and Practice for Members be amended to replace the American Psychological Association (APA) Ethics Standards with the Tri Council Policy Statement for Research involving Humans published by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, Natural Sciences and

The Council agreed that this document is a good resource and it is important to provide it to the members and considered whether it could be a topic at a future Barbara Wand Seminar.

The Council directed that the Registrar get legal advice on how the "Information for members" from Custody and Access Taskforce could be provided to the members so that it would not be perceived as a Standard of Professional Conduct
