No, however in April 2022, under the auspices of the College's Equity Diversion and Inclusion (EDI) Working Group, the College distributed a voluntary and anonymous EDI survey to the membership. The survey was an effort to gather information on the diversity of the College membership such as race/ethnic/cultural background, religious affiliation, sexual orientation, gender identities, disability. We received 1171 responses, approximately 25% of the membership. The Working Group is reviewing the information received with the intention of reporting to the membership in the near future.
